Check-in Assessments

Congratulations are in order for our year 5 students having recently completed the DoE Check-in Assessments. Whilst this is just one snapshot from one day for our students, the fast turnaround of the results means that the Instructional Leader and class teacher can meet and use this along with other school-based data to make decisions about programming for next term.

Initial findings from the Check-in Assessment data: In Numeracy,

Strengths for students were Measurement and Features of shapes and objects.

Goals in Numeracy will be in relating to Units of Time and measuring time, an area that will be covered more extensively in Term 4.

In Reading our student's strengths lie in the processes of interpreting abstract or remote content and evaluating text for relevance to purpose and audience. Goals in Reading are in continuing to develop skills in inferring meaning across a range of texts and citing evidence to support the inference.
