## A Reminder to all Families

Students should not attend school if unwell, even with mild symptoms of COVID-19. Any person with any COVID-19 symptoms will be sent home and should not return until they have received a negative test result or after 10 days if a test cannot be taken and are symptom-free. In circumstances where children have other medical reasons for recurrent symptoms a letter from their GP is sufficient to negate the requirement for a negative test.



## COVID-19

Parents please be reminded that the COVID-19 virus is still active. We all need to abide by the policies and guidelines of the Department of Education.

- QR Code-Check In at School Office
- Hand Sanitise
- Social Distancing

If your child is unwell, please keep them at home until they have recovered. If they have flulike symptoms they need to be tested and provide a copy of a negative COVID-19 test result and be symptom-free before being permitted to return to school.

Students who do not undertake a COVID-19 test will not be permitted to return to school for a 10-day period and present a medical certificate. Additionally, they must be symptom-free for a least 3 days prior to returning to school.

## Trawalla Nut Farm Excursion

The whole school will be going on an Excursion to the Trawalla Nut Farm on Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> July. Students are to wear old cloths, hat and boots for the day. They will need to bring along a packed morning tea and water bottle. They will also need to bring a plastic bucket and gloves to collect the nuts. ## Literacy in Years 3-6

Years 3-6 have been learning about how to interpret and infer from text. We are looking in particular at the picture book "Fox" by Margaret Wild. It is a story about the relationships between three characters and centres around the themes of love and belonging, temptation, risk and betrayal and friendship.

One of the elements that we are looking closely at is the characters themselves- what personality types are they and what drives them to do what they do in the story? We used the text and illustrations to help us determine this as well as the students own prior knowledge and experiences.

Students were placed in groups and had to brainstorm the personality traits of the three characters. These were discussed as a whole group and the students had to then relate the describing words they chose back to the story- essentially using the clues of text and illustration to justify their choices.

The students are working very well and are coming up with some intuitive vocabulary and ideas. Well done everyone!
















## Jumpstart Transition Program
