# Dear Parents and Caregivers

#### Ms. P's Update

Welcome back to school for 2023, and a special welcome to our families! I hope that everyone in our community had a safe and enjoyable holiday break, and that you had time to relax and connect with friends and family. Teachers were excited to meet their classes last week and to begin sharing a range of fabulous learning experiences they have planned for them. We have several additions to our staff this year. We welcome Ms. Leah Elliott and Ms. Hazel Palmer as classroom teachers.



### School Starting Time

School begins promptly each day at 9.00am. It is extremely important that students are at school and ready to begin their learning at this time, so it is a good idea that students make sure they are on the school grounds at least 5 minutes prior to this time. When students arrive at school, they should place their schoolbag on their bag hook and make their way to the playground where a teacher will be on duty from 8.30am.

#### Back to School Vouchers

As we prepare for another year of learning in 2023, you can now apply for the Premier's Back to School NSW program, offering \$150 worth of vouchers (3  $\times$  \$50 vouchers) to help pay for school supplies like school uniforms, shoes, bags, textbooks, and stationery. Every primary and secondary school student in NSW is eligible for the vouchers. You can

apply for and access your vouchers in your Services account, in the Service NSW app, by calling Service NSW on 137788 or by visiting your local Service Centre.

Each voucher can only be redeemed once. If the transaction is less than the total value of the voucher, the remaining balance is forfeited and cannot be used in another transaction, e.g., if the transaction is for the textbooks costing \$17.00, the remaining \$34.00 is forfeited. To be eligible, your child needs to be a NSW resident and enrolled in a NSW primary or secondary school in 2023. It will ensure students develop strong foundations for learning, life, and work in a complex and fast changing world. Here at Pallamallawa, we have been preparing for the new curriculum with the purchasing of resources and engaging in teacher professional learnings around the syllabus documents and units of work. We also recognize the existing quality programs we have at the school such as Smart Spelling and the Diagnostic Synthetic Phonics program. This year, while our teachers are engaging with the new curriculum, we will also incorporate these programs to ensure consistency during this period of change.

# Curriculum Reform Fast Facts



Welcome to 2023! Each newsletter I will be sharing some facts about the curriculum reform with you. Keep an eye out for parent information sessions throughout the school year.

#### 1. What is the Curriculum Reform?

The first comprehensive review of the curriculum since 1989 has been completed. NSW has chosen to go to a state-based curriculum for K-12 students. This reform aims to ensure what we are teaching is relevant to the 21st century learner by 'streamlining' the curriculum. The new syllabus documents are research based and implement evidence-based pedagogy (principles that guide practise).

#### 3. Decodable readers

A decodable text is one that can be read using the alphabetic code. For example sounding out c-a-t then blending the sounds to make cat.

The use of decodable texts is now mandated in the K-2 English syllabus. At PPS we have purchased a large amount of decodable texts for in class use and as home readers where appropriate.



#### 2. Implementation Timeline

2023:

K-2 English and Mathematics

2024:

3-6 English and Mathematics

2025:

K-6 Science & Technology, HSIE, PDHPE and Creative Arts
