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STEM DAY

Pallamallawa Students joined with Gravesend and Croppa Creek students by a Teams Zoom meeting on Tuesday 18th, to partake in a STEM day.

The STEM day activities aimed to educate students about Natural Disasters, specifically earthquakes, through a combination of video learning, discussion, and hands-on engineering challenges. The students watched a video that highlighted the causes of earthquakes, the

geological processes involved, and the effects on the earth's surface and structures.

Students were divided into groups and they had to design and build a LEGO tower that can withstand simulated earthquake conditions. This part of the activity encouarges teamwork, creativity, and application of engineering.

Students observed how their structures responded to the shaking and recorded any failures or collapses.

After testing, students discussed what worked and what didn't in their designs. Students gained a deeper understanding of earthquakes and their effects on the envirnoment.
